Debate in a Box is a twelve-week program that supports new debaters and coaches by combining skill development, practice, and competition around the annual national policy debate topic. The scaffolded curriculum builds foundational knowledge, research, argumentation, and strategic thinking.

Aligned with NFHS, NSDA, and NDCA standards, the program is turn-key for schools. Coaches with little or no debate experience can easily implement it using the provided materials, while novice students gain full support in learning core debate skills.

By introducing policy debate in an accessible way, Debate in a Box helps schools build sustainable programs, engage students with real-world issues, and highlight the educational value of debate.
