Getting Ahead on Homecoming 2026 Planning

Homecoming week is one of the most exciting times of the school year, a celebration of community, tradition, and pride. For many schools, that week centers around a big football game, but planning it all starts much earlier than most people realize.

If you're already looking ahead to next year's homecoming, the key is understanding how football schedules are built. The Colorado High School Activities Association (CHSAA) works closely with athletic directors to create balanced and organized schedules across the state. For the 2026 season, that process begins with the formation of leagues on November 5th.

Leagues will be released either November 5th or November 12th, allowing athletic directors to start scheduling games for the upcoming two-year cycle. From there, league approvals move through CHSAA's Classification and League Organizing (CLOC) Committee, which reviews and finalizes recommendations. The CHSAA Legislative Council will then take the final vote on February 3rd.

Once the league alignments are approved, schools can begin considering additional factors—like rival matchups, community events, and other school activities—to determine their homecoming date and opponent.

So, if your student council, booster club, or leadership team is eager to start planning an unforgettable homecoming week, remember: it all starts with the schedule. Keep an eye on those key CHSAA dates, and you'll be ready to get a jump on the celebrations that bring your whole school together.
