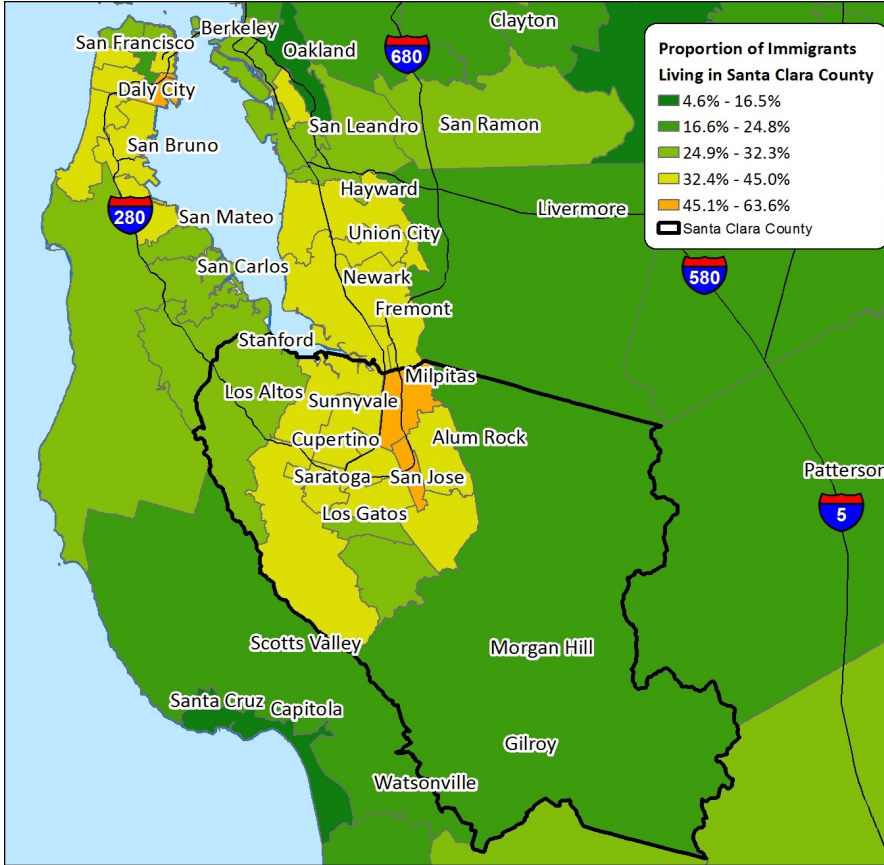

Proportion of Immigrants Living in Santa Clara County, CA

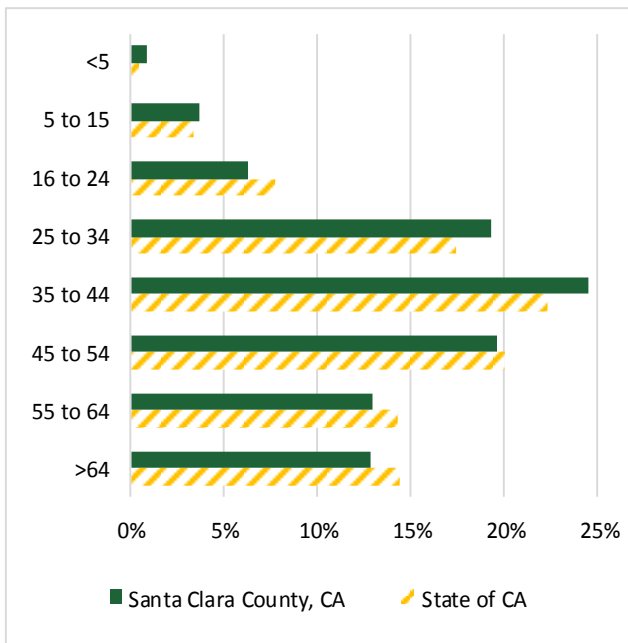


The map on the left presents the proportion of immigrants living in Santa Clara county. The cities within Santa Clara county with the greatest percentage of immigrants include San Jose and Milpitas and the cities with the lowest percentage of immigrants include Gilroy and Morgan Hill.

Of the approximately 687,815 immigrants who live in Santa Clara County, 25 percent are between the ages of 35 to 44 years old. The mean age for immigrants in Santa Clara county is 44 and the mean age for immigrants in California is 45 years old.

Of the top 10 languages spoken in Santa Clara county, 25 percent of immigrants speak Spanish and 51 percent of immigrants living in California speak Spanish as well. Approximately 10 percent of immigrants living in Santa Clara County and California speak English.

Age Among Immigrants in Santa Clara County, CA and in the State of California



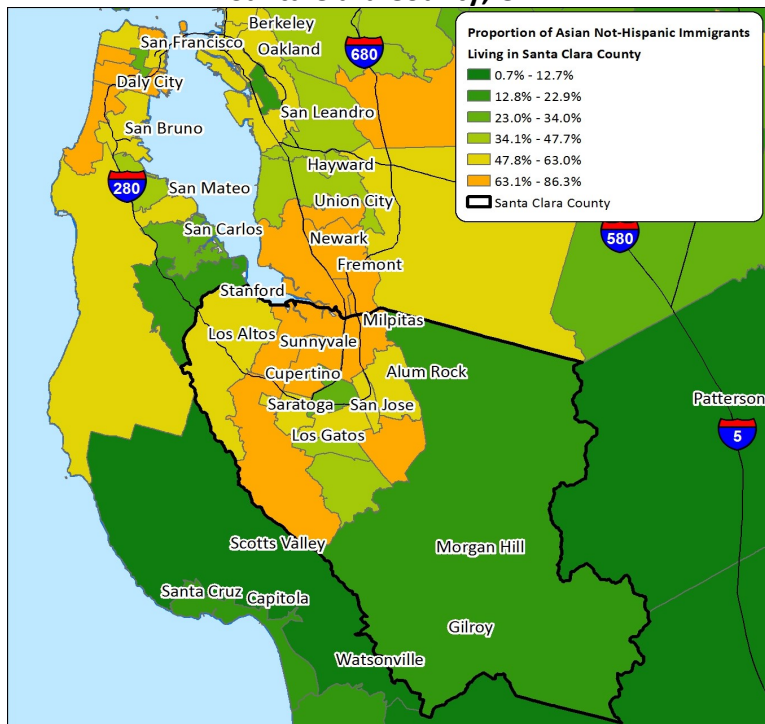

Proportion of Asian Non-Hispanic Immigrants living in Santa Clara County, CA

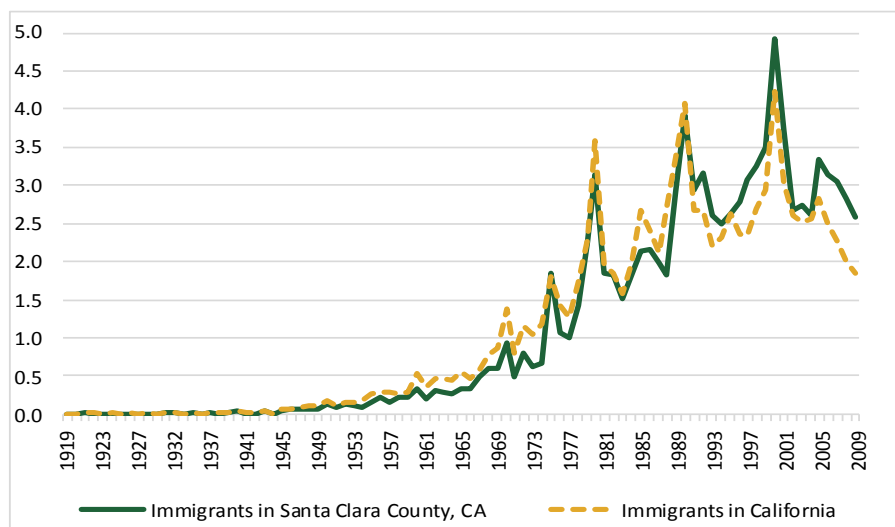


The map on the left shows the proportion of immigrants who are Asian non-Hispanic living in Santa Clara County. Areas in yellow and orange represent the largest groups of Asian immigrants. The highest concentration of Asian immigrants are living in the northwest portion of the county (i.e. Silicon Valley).

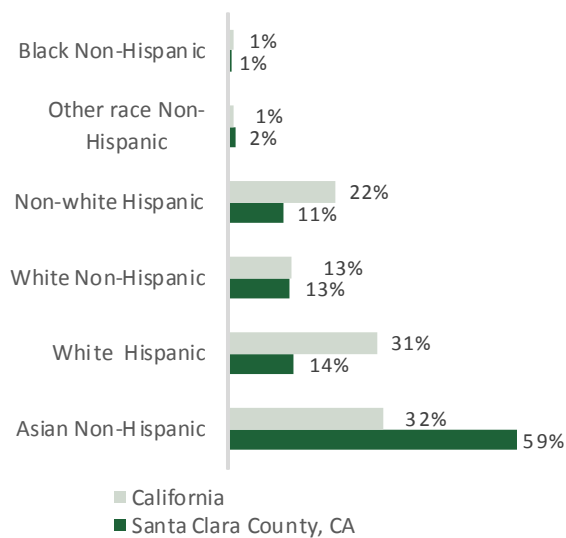
The mean year of immigration for immigrants living in Santa Clara county was 1993 and the mean year of immigration for immigrants living in the state of California was 1990. The year 2000 had the largest increase in immigration to both Santa Clara county and the state of California (4.9 percent and 4.2 percent respectively).

With regard to race and ethnicity, Asian not-Hispanic immigrants living in Santa Clara County are more prevalent than the proportions in the state of California (59 percent vs. 32 percent respectively).
