

Proportion of Immigrants With at Least a Bachelor's Degree in Washington County, Maryland




The map on the left presents the proportion of immigrants (ages 25+) who hold at least a bachelor's degree in Census tracts of Washington County, Maryland. Census tracts that contain relatively large proportion of immigrants with at least a bachelor's degree are located in the eastern part of the county.

According to the graph below and to the left, roughly 73 percent of immigrant households in Washington County are characterized by incomes greater than \$74,999.

According to the chart below, approximately 31 percent of immigrant households in Washington County identify as White, non-Hispanic.

Income among Immigrant Households in Washington County, Maryland and the U.S.





Most Common Year of Immigration among Immigrants in Washington County, Maryland




The map on the left presents the most common year of immigration among immigrants in Census tracts of Washington County. Census tracts in central Washington County contain immigrants who arrived to the United States in relatively recent years (2000 or later).

According to the graph below and to the left, roughly 51 percent of immigrant households in Washington County immigrated to the United States in 1994 or later years.

According to the chart below, the most commonly spoken language among immigrant households is English, followed by Spanish, Turkish, Korean, and Chinese.
