

Most Common World Region of Birth among Immigrants in Cass County, North Dakota




The map on the left presents the most common world region of birth per Census tract in Cass County. Immigrants from Europe and Asia are commonly found near the city of Fargo. Immigrants from Africa are commonly found to the north and northwest of Fargo. European immigrants are commonly found to the east of Fargo, and immigrants North America are found to the south and southwest of Fargo.

Note that a majority of immigrant adults (ages 25+) in Cass County do not have a Bachelor's degree. At the national level, a majority of immigrant adults do not have a college education.

Bosnia is the most common country of birth among immigrants in Cass County, followed by India, Iraq, Vietnam, and China. All other countries are found at a rate of 5 percent or less.



The table to the left presents the distribution of immigrant workers across occupational groups in Cass County. Approximately 16 percent of immigrant workers are found in Building, Grounds Cleaning, and Maintenance occupations. Roughly 13 percent of immigrant workers are found in production occupations.

Note that roughly 68 percent of full-time immigrant workers in Cass County make less than \$40,000 annually. Approximately 54 percent of full-time immigrant workers make less than \$40,000 at the national level.

Also, note that 57 percent of immigrants (ages 16+) in Cass County do not have any children of their own. This is compared to 50 percent at the national level.
