Proverbs—The Way of Wisdom

The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom (Proverbs 9:10). Right fear of God is that reverential fear which boldly leads us toward God and not crouching away from him. As we spiritually mature, we learn to apply godly wisdom to many areas of our lives.

The book of Proverbs, which we will study together on Tuesday mornings this fall, is a treasure trove of practical wisdom in poetic form. How wonderful that our creative God gives us his wisdom in this form, awakening our imaginations and stirring our hearts with "words fitly spoken, like apples of gold in settings of silver." These pithy and memorable statements are accessible to a child's understanding, yet so complex that we can ponder them throughout our lives and never fully plumb their depths.

Proverbs is a vast collection of wisdom writing that introduces many themes, revisiting them and intertwining them throughout the book. It often takes multiple readings for these themes to surface. A helpful way to study the book is to read daily the chapter which corresponds to that day's date. So why not begin on September 1 by reading Proverbs 1, and work your way through a chapter a day? If you follow this pattern until year's end, you will have read through Proverbs four times.

Memorization is the next step to deepening our understanding of Proverbs. See the verses in the side bar and consider committing them to memory as you explore the many themes of Proverbs.

For an in-depth study of these topics, join us on Tuesday mornings beginning September 11. If you are unable to join us, contact Jean-Marie VunCannon in the church office to learn how you can access the large group teaching online. And consider using the study guide by Kathleen Buswell Nielson, *Proverbs, the Way of Wisdom*, which is the source for the topics and suggested memory verses listed to the right.
