HOW TO MAKE WISE USE OF YOUR TIME

3. Concentration and diligence--do the task you select whole heartedly. Do one thing at a time and stay with it until it (or the part of it selected) is completed. Don't have a "grasshopper" mind.

Lesson 6: Meditation

Meditation on the Word of God is perhaps the most neglected single spiritual avenue of blessing that Christians have today. It is the doorway to the application of the great truths of the Bible to our hearts. Meditation has been called "reflective thinking with a view to application." Scriptural giving should include these steps:

1. Recognize that it all belongs to the Lord!
2. Thoughtfully decide what percentage of your income you will give to the Lord's work—a minimum below which you will not go.
3. Set this portion aside first whenever you receive money. Put this aside to be used as He leads; once set aside it is His and shouldn't be dipped into for personal needs—even to borrow.
4. Prayerfully distribute the Lord's money as He directs. It is usually good to do this at a regular time—weekly or monthly.

Appendix: Following Jesus Publicly

INTRODUCTION

According to the Great Commission given in Matthew 28:19-20 becoming a disciple of Jesus Christ involves two major steps or phases: (1) being baptized and (2) being taught how to obey all that Christ has commanded.

When a person publicly submits to water baptism he is proclaiming to all the world that he wants to make public what has already taken place in his heart. By faith he has become identified with Jesus Christ and now through baptism he publicly identifies with Him.

Following Jesus Christ our Saviour is both a private and a public matter. Christ always asked and expected believers to let others know they were following Him, who was their Lord.

You have already decided privately to commit your life to Jesus Christ, and follow Him. Our Lord meant for His disciples to follow Him openly.

STEPS AS A FOLLOWER OF CHRIST

1. Confess Christ publicly. According to Romans 10:8-10 confession with the mouth is an evidence of the faith that has been exercised in the heart.
2. Be baptized publicly. This is an opportune time to share your faith in Christ publicly if you did not respond to a public invitation to receive Christ. "Go ye therefore and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit" (Matthew 28:19). This command for baptism, given by Christ, gives us both the formula and the importance of baptism.
 - a. The basic lesson of baptism: it identifies us with Jesus Christ and His work (Acts 2:38) and it is a physical act revealing a previous spiritual experience (I Peter 3:21).

b. Baptism immediately after conversion was the universal practice in the early Church. Examples: Acts 2:37-41; 8:35-39; 16:25-34

3. Be publicly received into membership of a local church that preaches and teaches the Bible. The Bible specifically commands us to not forsake "our own assembling together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another; and all the more, as you see the day drawing near" (Heb. 10:25). Christ wants you to be a part of a local church so that you can be taught His Word, fellowship with His people, participate in worship and be a part of a corporate witness to the unsaved in your community (Acts 2:42-47).



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
