

Community Group Discipleship Outcome Questions

Pursuit of God

In light of God reconciling us to Himself, there is a detailed knowledge and understanding of God that comes from pursuing Him as our greatest treasure.

- **Gather** together weekly with the people of God in obedience to God's command, desiring to participate in the public means of God's grace (the preaching of God's Word, the Lord's supper, and baptism, teaching one another in song, etc.), and aspiring to love and encourage others.
- **Read** Scripture at least 5 days a week for 10 minutes a day understanding that the Scriptures are given that we may know God as well as what he requires of us and that we may be complete, equipped for every good work.
- **Pray** at least 5 days a week for 10 minutes a day understanding both that God is in control of the world and that all efforts performed by human strength are in vain believing that we are called to depend on God for all things.
- **Memorize** 1 verse a week desiring to not sin against our God and knowing the blessedness of the person who meditates on the law.

What has God taught you about himself through his Word either through private and/or public worship?

How have you been encouraged and strengthened by the truth of God's revelation? How have you been challenged to respond in repentance or obedience to what God has revealed?

What has been your greatest struggle with pursuing God lately? What will you do about that?

Fruit of the Spirit

The acting presence of the Holy Spirit in the life of the Church that demonstrates the character of God and distinguishes His people from and unbelieving world.

Love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control.

Where have you seen evidence of God's character in your relationships lately?

In what circumstances have you lacked these attributes? What do you believe is the underlying cause of this struggle? How do you need to respond?

Stewardship or Life

Faithfully using everything that God has entrusted us with to reflect His glory.

Understanding that all of life belongs to God and that we are merely managers of it, we will live in such a way that we use, share, and give all that we have to demonstrate our dependence on and bring glory to God. This includes our **Finances, Relationships, Possessions & Time**

What has God entrusted to you to use, give away, or share?

How have you utilized those things or held them back?

What is preventing you from stewarding that for God's glory?



Spiritual Giftedness

Discovering who God has uniquely made us to be and surrendering ourselves to His purpose, serving both the Church and the world with the gifts He has given.

- **Search** for the personal needs that exist in proximity to you in the Body of Christ and in the world.
- **Examine** how you can address some of those needs through the working of the Spirit in and through you. Pray daily that God would give you the heart of a servant.
- **Serve** in faith followed by an evaluation, in consultation with Christ's people, of the resulting fruit.

What needs in the Church and the world have you recognized lately? Who is in need in my life? In what ways, do you believe that you can pour out your life for the glory of God and the good of others?



Grace Story

Embracing the fullness of the Gospel and being transformed in such a way that we desire to live it out.

- **Identify** people in your family, friends, coworkers, and neighbors who are not yet followers of Jesus.
- **Pray** for them daily
- **Engage** at least on person a week in conversation, lunch or coffee.
- **Share** the truth of the gospel through the grace that God has given you through your own life.

Inductive Study Questions

Observation

- What repeated words, phrases or ideas are present in the text?
- What subject is being talked about/addressed (one word)?

Interpretation

- What is the big idea of the passage? What is being said about the one word subject? Be specific and try to stick to the wording of the Biblical text.
- How does this passage relate to what the author has said before?

Application

- Does this passage teach me anything about God? Does it teach me anything about people?
- Is there an aspect of God's character to prompt worship, a promise to be embraced, or a command to be obeyed?
- If the Word of God is suppose to be a lamp, how can I share this with someone in the coming week?
