Chapter 47 of our Book of Church Order has some helpful reminders about public worship. For the next few weeks we will include some of these on the announcement sheet as space permits. Here is the first installment:

1. Since the Holy Scriptures are the only infallible rule of faith and practice, the principles of public worship must be derived from the Bible, and from no other source. The Scriptures forbid the worshipping of God by images, or in any other way not appointed in His Word, and requires the receiving, observing, and keeping pure and entire all such religious worship and ordinances as God hath appointed in His Word.
