***The Affirmation of Faith**

From Larger Catechism Questions 91, 95, and 97

Minister: What is the moral law?

All: The moral law is the declaration of the will of God to mankind, directing and binding everyone to personal, perfect, and perpetual conformity and obedience. It requires the performance of all those duties of holiness and righteousness which he owes to God and man: promising life upon the fulfilling, and threatening death upon the breach of it.

Minister: What use is there of the moral law to the regenerate?

All: Although they that are regenerate, and believe in Christ, are delivered from the moral law as a covenant of works, so they are neither justified nor condemned by the law; it does inform them of the holy nature and will of God, and of their duty, binding them to walk accordingly; also, it shows them how much they are bound to Christ for His fulfilling it, and enduring the curse of the law in their place and for their good; and this should provoke them to more thankfulness, and to the expression of that thankfulness by taking greater care to conform themselves unto God's law as the rule of their obedience.
