ldentity Crisis

It had been an eventful and joyful day as we were making our way back to church riding on the church van. Our van full of volunteers had taken part in the Mission of Hope Christmas program at Yellow Creek Elementary School in Middlesboro, KY. Over 600 children filled the gym and participated in songs, games and a story before having the opportunity to choose some presents. It was a great event. Our van had a wide age range from elementary age to the "very mature." On the drive back we talked about many things. Riddles and "Knock, Knock" jokes dominated the conversation for a good portion of the time. Then the discussion took an interesting turn. Someone suggested that his coworkers often challenged his Christian beliefs, some from other denominations while others held to differing faiths. Another person talked about a friend who once worked in the ministry but now has become an atheist, and he described their ongoing dialogue about matters of belief and faith. Our lighthearted banter had taken a more serious turn. And being the "Pastor-in-Residence" on the van, all eyes turned to me for clarification and guidance. Don't get me wrong, I do love a good conversation and I most often have some ideas to share, yet I am also quick to acknowledge my own limitations and point to the source of truth, Christ, as the place to take our ultimate questions. We discussed these issues for some time and I felt like we had a good, open dialogue. It even seemed to be of interest to most everyone on the van since almost everyone jumped into the conversation. A really crucial moment came when the eldest statesmen among us suggested that this kind of conversation would

be helpful on a Sunday morning. I was able to tell him that he would not have to wait long to hear just that.

Beginning in January 2018, I will be talking about our Baptist Identity. It has become evident to me over the past few years that Christians in general and Baptists in particular are suffering from a bit of an identity crisis. The rapidly changing world is causing chaos and confusion while at the same time challenging every belief and boundary. It seems to me that we struggle to articulate our beliefs and therefore feel unprepared to face the competing voices that challenge us. Likewise, we guickly find ourselves drawn into the common mistake of hearing only the loudest and most extreme voices while at the same time getting overly focused on peripheral issues where it feels safer to make bold pronouncements. It is time for us to think seriously together about what we say we believe and even more importantly "who" we say we believe, namely Jesus, and what it looks like to follow Him faithfully. To assist our good dialogue, I will be teaching from a book called "The Four Fragile Freedoms" on Wednesdays which will follow the previous Sunday's topic. That way we can meet to discuss in depth these very important issues. I do hope you plan to attend both Sunday services and the Wednesday dialogue sessions. I look forward to having this great conversation with you.
