

WHAT TO BRING

ITINERARY

Monday, July 2, 7:00 a.m. Leave at 7:30 sharp

Eat breakfast beforehand. Load up the bus. Bring snacks & fun stuff for the 6-ish hour trip to Kansas City. Lunch stop on the road (bring \$). We'll take a few breaks along the way. Unload at The Westin Hotel. Grab dinner on your own in Kansas City. Go to first Live Sent! Session at 7:00 p.m.

Saturday, July 7, be at bus at 7:30 a.m.

Pack up and bring your bags to the bus. Board the bus. Breakfast stop on the road (bring \$). Lunch stop on the road (bring \$). We'll take a few breaks along the way. Unload at First Free Church.

CONFERENCE GUIDELINES

RESPECT: During your stay in Kansas City you represent Jesus Christ, Challenge and our local Kansas City churches. Look for ways to show respect, politeness, appreciation and courtesy to everyone including hotel staff, convention center staff, and the people of Kansas City.

SAFETY: Remember that we are in a city. High school students must travel in groups of four or more and be sure to always let an adult know where you are going. Students must check in with an adult before leaving the hotel or sessions.

BOUNDARIES: No student or youth worker may enter the hotel floor or room of a member of the opposite sex for any reason. Some floors may be co-ed and appropriate rules will be posted. Violation of this rule could mean immediate removal from the conference at the student's own expense. Challenge is a community event and not a dating opportunity. Spend time with all your friends.

ATTENDANCE: Students must attend all Gatherings, Meals and Huddles.

DRESS CODE: No short shorts, low cut shirts, or exposed midriffs for females, and males must have a shirt on at all times except when swimming. In an effort to maintain modesty, all female swimsuits should be a one piece or midriff covering bathing suit; males must wear trunk style bathing suits. Shoes are to be worn at all times for health and safety reasons. Youth workers and conference personnel are permitted to request a student to change into more modest attire.

LANYARDS: Wearing lanyards is mandatory for admittance & security. Lanyards must be worn and are required for entry to Challenge Gatherings, meals, housing and recreation. Replacements - \$10.

HOTEL: All students are to be in their hotels at 11:30 p.m., quiet and in rooms at midnight. Participants are to stay in the hotels until 6 a.m. unless accompanied by an adult. No student may enter the hotel room of a member of the opposite sex for any reason. Utilize the lobby, convention center, and outdoors for co-ed socializing.

HEALTH: Drink water! Dehydration and heat exhaustion could bring an early end to your time at Challenge. Be sure to drink a lot of WATER, avoiding sodas & caffeinated drinks.

TECHNOLOGY: To help you be fully present for all that God has for you and for your safety; all technology is to be left in hotel rooms. The exception to this is cell phones. **Cell phones should be silenced and put away during Gatherings and Equipping Labs.**

PROHIBITED MATERIALS: Illegal drugs, alcohol, weapons, fireworks, pornography and/or other illegal substances are prohibited at Challenge. Any Challenge participants found with these materials will be sent home at their own expense. Report any drug use, alcohol, or other prohibited behavior to conference staff.
