FROM YOUR PASTOR'S DESK

Year after year the Super Bowl is watched by more Americans than any other event. It is not just about watching the game (or the commercials), it has become a social event that gives us an excuse to have a party and eat too much. The game this year (for those of you who watched), was very exciting, with the Eagles soaring to victory, much to the delight of the city of Philadelphia. For me the most thrilling part of the Super Bowl ended up being the post-game interviews. As the coach of the Eagles took the microphone during the trophy ceremony he said with all his heart, "I want to give the praise to my Lord and Savior Jesus Christ for giving me this opportunity." Several other players including the quarterback and the receiver who caught the winning touchdown also gave the glory to God when given the chance.

As I have been thinking and preaching about stewardship in recent weeks, one of the ideas I wrote down was the "stewardship of opportunity." We need to be sensitive to those situations that God brings into our lives where we can bless those around us, and especially our brothers and sisters in Christ. If the Lord places someone on your heart, write them a note, give them a call, speak a word of encouragement. Just this morning as I was going through my emails I came across some encouraging notes from friends last year that re-encouraged me. Your prayers, notes, and acts of kindness have richly blessed me and my family. When the Holy Spirit shows you a way that you can "do good" to others, don't think twice, don't wait, be a good steward of the opportunity.

In addition, Ephesians 5:15,16 exhorts us to: "Be very careful, then, how you live—not as unwise but as wise, making the most of every opportunity, because the days are evil." Are we good stewards of the opportunities we have to witness to Jesus and the gospel? As we live, and work, and interact in this dark world, our words and our lives can bring light by bearing witness to our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Be a good steward this week of the opportunities that God presents to you-whether it be to millions, or to just one!
