Normally we try to encourage people with things like, "hope you get that raise!" or "you look great! Have you lost weight?" or "keep studying, you'll eventually get into grad school," etc... you know, things of the world. Now don't get me wrong, there's nothing inherently wrong with these things or with encouraging others with them but are they the highest and most soul-satisfying things with which to encourage someone?

That's what got me thinking about the *content* of encouragement. I'm sure we'd all agree we're supposed to say nice things to people but rarely do we ask, "what should the content of my encouragement be?"

A clarifying question might be, "with what does God encourage me?" Cars? Boats? Homes? Vacations? Raises? No. God encourages me with Christ? And is Christ not the greatest "thing" any of us could have? Yes. And so God speaks kind, gracious words to us with Christ-filled content.

Hebrews 10:19-22 tells us (paraphrased): we can have confidence to enter the Most Holy Place by the blood of Jesus, because we have a great High Priest who has completely cleansed us; therefore, encourage one another. In other words, the reason and the content of our encouragement is the Person and work of Christ.

So as we seek to build each other up in the Lord, let's make sure Jesus Christ is the subject of our discussion and delight.

PASTOR STEVE'S CORNER







"The Holy Spirit, Our Helper"

"Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought..." (Ro. 8:26). How good it is to know that the Spirit "helps" us, literally "takes hold together" with us in our weakness... Why do we have this Spirit? The Spirit is God's own breath by which we live and pray, our Helper and Guide. The Spirit is God suffering with us in the worst of times, praying from our hearts when we can barely groan. That's who he is. How shall we honor the Spirit in our praying and respond to his work? See if this sounds to you like a fitting resolve: in my every prayer I will seek to depend on the Spirit. Let me remember how living prayer comes from him; let me wait on him for quickening and direction; and let me trust that he is there, on my side, pulling for me, when I'm too weary or weak even to cry, "Help!"

Dr. William Brownson, "Courage to Pray," p. 43,4

"I will ask the Father and he will give you another helper to be with you forever...the Spirit of truth. When the Helper comes, whom I will send, he will bear witness about me...It is to your advantage that I go away, for if I do not go away, the Helper will not come to you...when he comes he will convict...he will guide you into all truth...he will glorify me...he will take what is mine and declare it to you." John 14,15,16 (Selected vs. ESV)

The Armorbearer Intercession

Armorbearers were personal attendants of a warrior chieftain who accompanied him in dangerous missions. Armorbearers holding huge shields sometimes surrounded their leader to protect him from attack. As the Armorbearers protected the warrior chief from the enemy's arrows, so church members' intercessory prayers can protect their pastor from "the flaming arrows of the evil one" (Ephesians 6:16).
