☞ **Power of a Praying Wife (women only)**


South Hall, Room 403


☞ **Young Adults**


☞ **The Power of Suffering: *Strengthening Your Faith in the Refiner's Fire*** **FH, Room 401**

A study of this Discourse is therefore basic to a proper understanding of the roles, responsibilities, relationships and resources which Christ has planned and provides in a believer's life for ministry today within the Church and the dying world around us.
