

The deeper the engagement, the more difficult is the retreat. Neglect can become unwillingness and obstinacy. The habit of sin will at length turn into necessity. Antidotes against poison must not be delayed. The longer a tenant fails to pay his rent, the harder it will be for him to make it up. A nail driven into wood is more difficult to draw out when it is driven up to the head! The longer wood lies in water, the harder it is to burn. The longer Satan's possession has been, the more difficult will be his ejection. Every delay

makes your return to God seem more impossible. Goliath must be smitten in the forehead and Satan opposed often. The sooner you begin, and the faster your work in this day of grace, the sweeter will your sleep be in the evening. How sweet it is in older age to feed upon the comforts of a well-spent youth. Early beginnings in godliness make an easy deathbed. Salvation is a work of absolute necessity. Other things are maybes at the best, but salvation needs immediate attention and is an indispensable necessity. A work of necessity must not be put off to a time of uncertainty. You may be excused in the day of judgment for leaving anything in the world undone besides the getting of salvation. You may be excused if you had no time to get riches and honours of the world. But what if you have not looked after eternal life? Can you say you had another employment more necessary? Can you say you were taken up with something more needful or useful? If you delay, delay in looking for riches and honour, and the vanities of the world! O, but now, now, now pursue salvation! It is a must-be! If the present time is gone, you may be undone forever.
