LESSON MEMORY VERSE:

BIBLE STORY:

The Cross (based on Matthew 27:31-61)

ACTIVITIES:

Making a Tomb Picture

Supplies: large and small plates (one per child), paper fasteners, brown or black crayons.

Cut a straight section off the bottom of the large paper plate so that it is horseshoe-shaped. Also, cut a half circle shape to represent the doorway. This will represent the doorway. Cut a circle form the small paper plate large enough to cover the doorway to represent the stone. Punch a small hole through each plate for attaching the stone to the cave. Give a cave, stone, and paper fastener to each child and show them how to attach the paper fastener. They can see the cave closed and then roll away the stone to see that the cave is empty. Jesus is not dead anymore. He is alive again!

Happy-Sad Plate Puppets

Supplies: two paper plates per child, large craft sticks, stapler, crayons, markers

Staple two paper plates together so the backs are facing outward. Insert a large craft stick in between the plates and staple securely. Give each child a set of plates and have them draw with crayons or markers a happy face on one side and a sad face on the other side. Tell the Bible story again where Jesus' friends buried his body in a cave and how sad they must have been. Have the children show with their plate puppets how they might have looked. Then read in the Bible where what happened after three days with Jesus' friends went to look at the cave and what they found there. Have the children show with their puppets how they might have looked.
