Bryant Wood was born in Endicott NY. After graduating from high school he attended Syracuse University on an athletic scholarship, graduating with a B.S. degree in mechanical engineering. Wood worked for the General Electric Company in Schenectady, held various positions at the Knolls Atomic Power Laboratory, then earned a M.S. degree in mechanical engineering from Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute in Troy NY.



In 1973 Wood left G.E. to pursue Biblical and archaeological studies. He earned a M.A. degree in Biblical History from the University of Michigan in 1974, and a Ph.D. degree in Syro-Palestinian archaeology from the University of Toronto in 1985. He is on the Board of Directors of the Near East Archaeological Society and a Fellow of the Institute for Biblical Research. He is currently Director of research with the Associates for Biblical Research, Akron PA and Consulting Editor of their quarterly publication Bible and Spade. He has extensive archaeological field work in the Middle East that includes northern Jordan, the Wadi Tumilat Project excavation at Tell el-Maskhuta, Egypt, excavation at Haruvit in the northern Sinai, survey of the Wadi Tumilat, Egypt, and excavation at Khirbet Nisya, Israel.

Bryant and his wife Faith reside in Manheim PA. They have four children and nine grandchildren.
