Grace Family:

The Go Team has been hard at work, getting the pieces in place for the Conditional Use Permit (CUP) application to be turned in to the City of Orange. In the process, we have had to wrestle with some issues, namely the existing sewer and water lines that service the Children's building and how their placement would affect the Multiplex building and future extension.

We decided as a team to leave the Multiplex in the corner where it was, but turn it 90 degrees so that the length of it runs north to south. We feel this will keep the largest part of the open grass available for play. This also means we won't relocate the elementary playground or modulars at this time.

We will be submitting the initial CUP plans to reflect just the covered sports court, not the potential future extension. We would like to keep our options open for the future, without being tied to putting the final, permanent building on the end of the steel sports building to replace the modulars. We will show the steel building on the plans as the original size (~70'x 100').

The submitted plans are our intention to move forward, but are subject to design review and plan check. The current submission or design may be changed by the recommendations from the City of Orange. If the City requires us to show plans for the eventual removal of the modulars, we will then go back to the larger steel building, showing the proposed future build out.
