Bible Reading:

Catechism:

35. What is adoption?

Adoption is an act of God’s free grace, whereby all those who are justified are received into the number, and have a right to all the privileges of the sons of God.

(John 1:12; Romans 8:17; 1 John 3:1)

36. What is sanctification?

Sanctification is the work of God’s free grace, whereby His elect are renewed in the whole man after the image of God, and are enabled more and more to die to sin and live to righteousness.

(Romans 6:4-6; 8:1; Galatians 5:24; Ephesians 4:23-24; Philippians 1:6; 2:12-13; 2 Thessalonians 2:13; 1 John 5:4)

37. What are the benefits in this life that flow from justification, adoption, and sanctification?

The benefits in this life that flow from justification, adoption, and sanctification are assurance of God’s love, peace of conscience, joy in the Holy Spirit, increase of grace and perseverance to the end.

(Proverbs 4:18; Romans 5:1-2, 5; 14:17; 1 Peter 1:5)

38. What benefits do believers receive from Christ at death?

The souls of believers are, at their death, made perfect in holiness, and do immediately pass into glory; and their bodies, being still united to Christ, rest in their graves until the resurrection.

(Job 19:26-27; Isaiah 57:2; Luke 23:4; 2 Corinthians 5:1, 6, 8; Philippians 1:23; 1 Thessalonians 4:14, 16; Hebrews 12:23)
