Suggested items: (**No candy, seeds, fruit snacks, chocolate, weapons, liquids, vitamins, medication or toothpaste**)

- **Toys:** dolls, toy cars, stuffed animals, kazoos, harmonicas, yo-yos, jump ropes, balls, toys that light up and make noise (with extra batteries)
- **School Supplies:** pens, pencils and sharpeners, crayons, markers, notebooks, paper, solar calculators, small scissors, glue sticks, small coloring and picture books
- **Non-Liquid Hygiene Items:** toothbrushes, bar soap, combs, washcloths, etc.
- **Accessories:** t-shirts, socks, hats, flip flops, mittens, gloves, sunglasses, hair clips, jewelry, watches, flashlights (with extra batteries), small sewing kits, small tools.

Prepared meal for volunteers to reheat and serve.

Household Items: Liquid laundry detergent, Fabric softener, dryer sheets, Toothbrushes, toothpaste, personal sized hand sanitizers.

Kitchen Items: Liquid dish soap, Dishwashing detergent, Large Tupperware, Large zip lock storage bags.

Paper Goods: Paper towels, tissues, individually wrapped toilet paper rolls, 10-12 oz. disposable coffee cups and lids.

Pantry Items: Bottled water, Gatorade, Tea packets, pre-packaged snacks, canned tuna, canned fruit and fruit cups, sugar, popcorn.
