WHERE TO BEGIN?

DIGGING IN: What was the message about?

Why was it necessary for Jesus to bear our iniquities? (v. 11)

LIVE IT OUT: What do we do?

Do you remember the cross every day? What would make it easier for you to do that?

What is the biggest surprise to you about your long-term growth in Christ?

[Family Question]: Is there anything in our lives that makes it difficult to remember that we live in Christ?

Pray that we would remember the cross every day.

Today's Text: Isaiah 53:10-12

April 1, 2018

I. God's Will (v. 10)

Today's text:

<sup>10</sup>Yet it was the will of the LORD to crush him;  
he has put him to grief;<sup>l</sup>  
when his soul makes an offering for guilt,  
he shall see his offspring; he shall prolong his days;  
the will of the LORD shall prosper in his hand.

II. The Servant's Work (v. 11)

<sup>11</sup>Out of the anguish of his soul he shall see  
and be satisfied;  
by his knowledge shall the righteous one, my servant,  
make many to be accounted righteous,  
and he shall bear their iniquities.

III. The Servant's Reward (v. 12)

<sup>12</sup>Therefore I will divide him a portion with the many,  
and he shall divide the spoil with the strong,  
because he poured out his soul to death  
and was numbered with the transgressors;  
yet he bore the sin of many,  
and makes intercession for the transgressors.
