3. What are some practical ways this week that you can, by God's help, mortify the "flesh with its passions and desires"?



"To kill a man or other living thing, means to take away all his strength, vigor, and power, so that he cannot act or exert on his own. That is just what it means in this case. Indwelling sin is compared to a person, a living person, called "the old man." He has his way of thinking, his tendencies, his wisdom, craft, subtlety, and strength. This old man, says the apostle, must be killed, put to death, mortified. That is, the old man's power, life, vigor, and strength, his ability to produce effects, must be taken away by the Spirit. In fact, it is to be "crucified with Christ" as a good thing. We, as the "old man," are said to be "dead" with Christ. When we are resurrected in Christ and regenerated, a principle contrary to the old man, one designed to destroy him, is planted in our hearts. But the whole process towards perfection (Christ-like behavior) is carried on by degrees all of our life."
