1. Read Luke 8:4-15. How does this relate to our James message this week?
2. What are the prerequisites to receiving the Word?
3. How would you describe the process of 'receiving with meekness the implanted Word?'
4. How well are you doing with what you are hearing? In what areas of your life is the Word changing you?



Therefore, put away all filthiness and rampant wickedness and receive with meekness the implanted word, which is able to save your souls. -James 1:21

“When a person receives an organ transplant, such as a kidney, that organ is implanted into a person’s body; fashioned and installed into a natural process to serve a distinct purpose. That kidney, although foreign, is being placed there ultimately to save a person’s life. It is a great privilege to have had someone sacrifice a piece of themselves to give the hope of life to them. The person receiving the kidney must take care to do everything they possibly can to provide an environment that this new kidney can thrive in. It would be irresponsible to live in a manner that would reject that “life giving” kidney. The person should get plenty of rest, eat healthy, exercise, take their medications as prescribed and do all the other things the doctors tell them. They must also shed any bad habits that might increase the risk of rejection, such as smoking, drinking, or a poor diet.

This is a great visual to show what James is speaking of when he speaks of the implanted word. Much like the transplanted kidney which can save a life, the Word of God is implanted in us to save our souls. We as believers can “live our life” in a manner that reject or stifle that implanted word. James explains that we are to put away those things that are in our lives that are rejecting the word and receive, in faith and humility, the life saving word that was given to us by the sacrifice of the death and resurrection of God’s son, Jesus.”
