SOME HELPFUL INFORMATION

Nursery Care is provided in Love nursery from 9:30-11:30 am for newborn to age 2. Children under age 2 can be taken directly to the nursery (room 305) before the services. Children ages 2 and 3 may go to the Toddler '2' Three Garden Room (303) before the services.

“Camp Red Clay”

During the months of June through August, our children will enjoy Sunday school by exploring the stories of the bible with songs and games. All children will meet in Founders Hall and when the weather permits they will go outside and then return to the Sunday School rooms on the second floor. Children ages 4 through those entering 2nd grade will be dismissed from room 206 and parents are requested to pick up their child and sign them out from this room. Children entering 3rd through 5th grade can be found in room 204 and, along with middle school and high school children who will be assisting the Sunday School leaders, will be dismissed to Founders Hall where you can meet their beaming faces!

Join us for **Fellowship Time** in Founders Hall following the worship services for juice, coffee, snacks, and fellowship. To get to Founders Hall, exit the door at the front of sanctuary, turn left and then follow the hallway.

Restrooms are located on all three floors of the building; out the side door near the pulpit (then a 2nd left); the 2nd floor by the Fellowship Hall; in the classroom hallway; on the 1st floor in the hallway; and in Founders Hall.

A **Stephen Minister** is available in the Crossan Lounge following the Sunday morning worship services to listen and to talk with you confidentially about any personal concern.
