What is Ordination? Why do we do it?

Today is a special service in the life of Redeemer Presbyterian Church as Chris Millward and Wayne Bauers will officially become Elders and Timothy Schramm and David Van Dyk will become Deacons. The process by which this happens is called Ordination. This is a significant event, and is something that our reformed tradition takes very seriously. Keep in mind that the service today is the pinnacle of a year of study, exams, interviews, and other kinds of evaluations for these men.

According to our church constitution, "Ordination is the authoritative admission of one duly called to an office in the Church of God, accompanied with prayer and the laying on of the hands, to which it is proper to add the giving of the right hand of fellowship." The basis for this doctrine and practice comes from the New Testament itself. In several places we read that the Apostles set men apart to specific ministry offices in a public way through prayer and the laying on of hands. In Acts 6, the seven men who were selected to serve the church specifically in mercy ministry were "set before the Apostles, and they prayed and laid their hands on them" (Acts 6:6). Paul reminds Timothy of the "gift of God which is in you through the laying on of my hands," and also warns him not to "be hasty" in the laying on of hands (2 Tim 1:6; 1 Tim 5:22). In short, we see that it was common practice to set apart those who were called to specific ministry office in the Church through an authoritative laying on of hands and prayer. In our service today, the Session will administer vows to these men and to the congregation and then give pastoral exhortations to both as part of the Ordination process.




