Why Community Groups?

With the start of fall comes the start of a new season of community group ministry at Redeemer. If you have never participated in community groups, I want to invite and strongly encourage you to consider joining one this year. Our community groups are an integral part of the overall ministry of our church and help us prioritize (1) Fellowship, (2) Growth in the Word, (3) Prayer, (4) Outreach & Good Works. Let me say a word about each of these.

Fellowship -- Community groups are one of the easiest opportunities to be known and get to know others in the church. We don't want our church to be a place where there are numerous acquaintances, a few friendships, but little real biblical community. And genuine biblical community -- transparent, vulnerable, and life transforming relationships -- doesn't just happen, it takes intentional effort and prioritizing of time together. Community groups are "devoted to the fellowship" (Acts2:42) by eating together, celebrating together, and recreating together throughout the year.

Growth in the Word -- Community Groups are not just another Bible Study. Most groups actively discuss the sermons in their study time in order to "stir up one another to love and good works."

Prayer -- If we are not a praying church, we are not a biblical church. Community groups spend time in prayer on set topics each month so that our whole church is coming before our Father with a unified voice.

Outreach & Good Works -- Getting outside the four walls of the church is an important part of Christian witness in this world and our church mission. If we want to see God use our church to expand his kingdom in Traverse City, then we must have a plan of how we will "let our light shine before others so that they may see your good works and give glory to our Father who is in heaven." Each community group commits to a specific plan for how it will engage in outreach and works of service and love throughout the year.

I realize that being part of a community group is a commitment. But I and the elders want to encourage you to make that commitment. God calls his church to be a place where believers are "devoted to the apostles teaching, to the fellowship, to the breaking of bread, and to the prayers" (Acts 2:42). As we do that, not only will we personally reap spiritual blessings, but our church as a whole will be used of God as "salt and light" in Traverse City.
