Landscape:

- **Why it Matters:**

"What is it in the Christian faith that excites you? . . . Today there are endless subgroups of confessing Christians who invest enormous quantities of time and energy in one issue or another: abortion, pornography, home schooling, women's ordination (for or against), economic justice, a certain style of worship, the defense of a particular Bible version, and countries have a full agenda of urgent, peripheral demands. Not for a moment am I suggesting we should not think about such matters or throw our weight behind some of them. But when such matters devour most of our time and passion, each of us must ask: In what fashion am I confessing the centrality of the gospel?" – D.A. Carson

Ephesians "is a manifesto for the church, describing its essence and identity' who it is, how it came about, how it must conduct itself, and what its mission is within the larger framework of Christ's cosmic rule." – NIV study bible

Ephesians "holds us face to face with God, and what God is, and what God has done; it emphasizes throughout the glory and the greatness of God...We must not start by examining ourselves and our needs microscopically; we must start with God, and forget ourselves." – Martyn Lloyd Jones

- Mystery explained 1-6
- Mystery reveals God's manifold Wisdom 7-12
- Paul's suffering for the Gospel Mystery is worthwhile 13

3.14-21 Paul's corresponding prayer for the church

- Strengthened with power 16-17
- Rooted & Established in Love 17
- Grasping the magnitude of God's love 18-19
- Filled to the measure of all the fullness of God 19
- Amen 20-21

CHURCH: God's empowered workmanship

4.1-16 Church is called to...

- Walk in a worthy manner 1
- Maintaining unity of the Spirit 2-6
 - Pillar 1 - humility
 - Pillar 2 - gentleness
 - Pillar 3 - patience
- Be united, unique & maturing 7-16
 - Leaders uniquely contribute 7-14
 - Saints uniquely contribute 15-16
 - Side note: leaders are first and foremost saints...

4.17-6.9 As a new creation... walk as Children of light

- Put off/put on 4.17-32
- Be imitators of God 5.1-6.9
 - in contrast to the world (5.1-21)
 - worlds goods
 - worlds pleasures
 - worlds relationships
 - in your marriages (5.22-33)
 - in your family (6.1-1-4)
 - in your work (6.5-9)

6.10-20 You are warriors - dress for success and stand firm together

KEY LANDMARKS (Themes & Application)²:

Christ's work in reconciling and uniting the CHURCH to God is the dominant pulse of Ephesians. So, let's look at the various themes of Ephesians in light of how they relates to the Jesus' Church.

A FRESH VISION OF THE CHURCH

- *Conceived and formed in eternity past... (1.3-14; 2.4, 8-9)*
- *Once dead, now alive in Christ... (1.7; 2.1-12)*
- *Reconciled individuals and peoples to God through Christ (2.11-22)*
- *To represent Christ on earth (5.1-6.9)*
- *As Sojourners be a Contrast Kingdom (4.17-5.21)*
- *For the praise of his Glory (1.6, 14; 2.7-10)*

A FRESH COMMITMENT TO THE CHURCH

- *To unity (4.1-16)*
- *To purity (4.17-24)*
- *To victory over evil (6.10-20)*

A FRESH FAITH FOR THE CHURCH

- *There can be no doubt that God is fully committed to it – dearly loved, His bride, His body...*
- *God is empowering it...*
- *God will protect it...*
- *God will grow it...*
