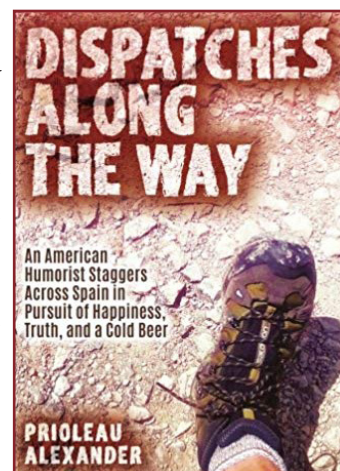

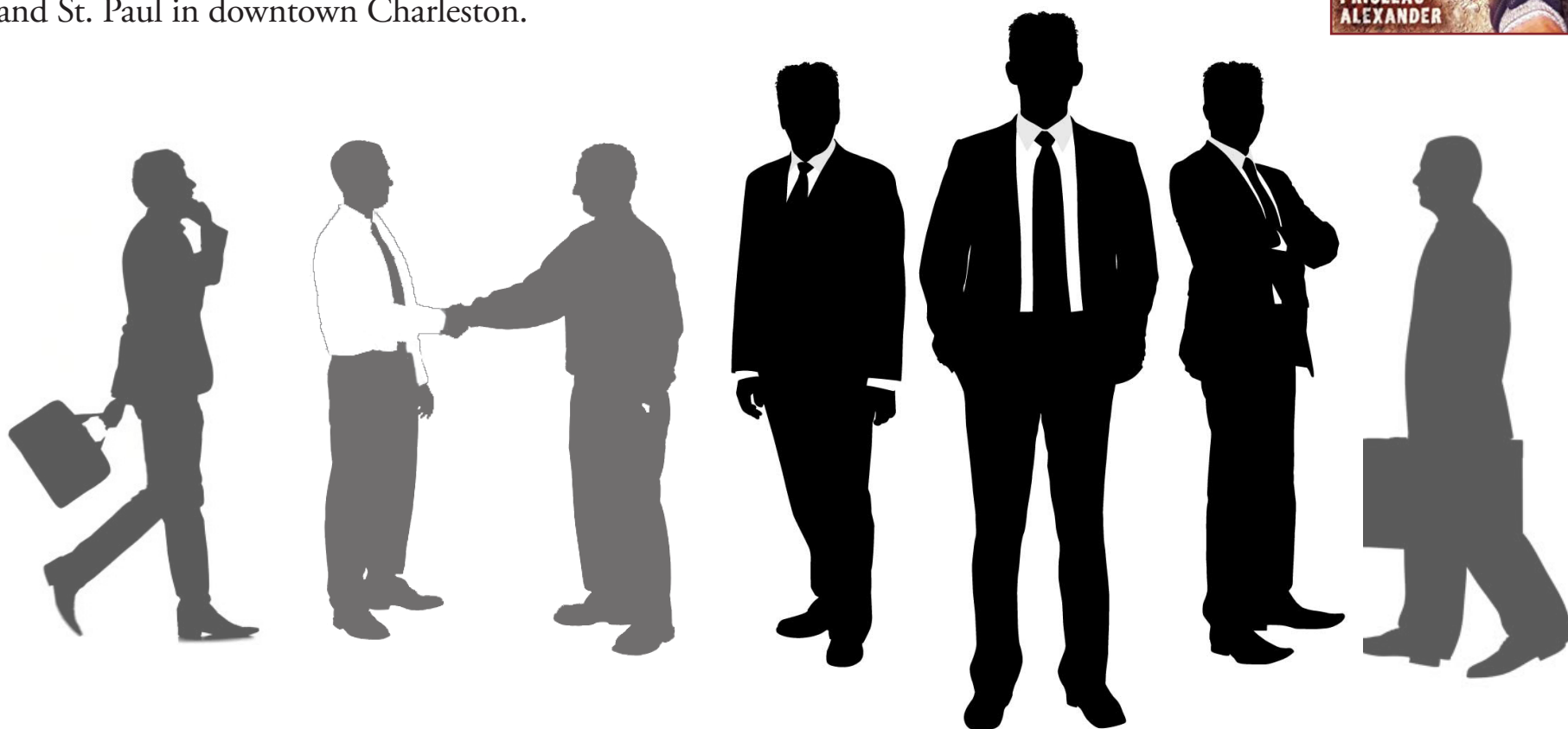
Charleston born and bred, Prioleau is a graduate of Porter-Gaud School. He graduated from Auburn University, where he was in the Marine ROTC and a member of Kappa Alpha Order. He served as a Lieutenant in the United States Marine Corps—3rd Assault Amphibian Battalion, 1st Marine Division, and 1st Armored Assault Battalion, 3rd Marine Division. Prioleau says, "I was a platoon commander for 10 of those big "amphibious tanks" you see in the movies ... the ones that drive out the stern of a ship (and somehow don't sink), swim to shore, then revert to being tracked vehicles."

Author of the Southern Independent Bookseller Association best-seller *You Want Fries With That?*, Prioleau has published his new book, *Dispatches Along the Way*, describing his month-long pilgrimage on the Camino de Santiago in Northern Spain. Writing in his



familiar style of keen observation, he provides in *Dispatches* a look at "an American humorist's pursuit of happiness, theological truth, and a cold beer."

In his talk, Prioleau will offer thoughts on the meaning of happiness and the role God plays in that pursuit. Prioleau is a writer and director of advertising for The Charleston Mercury, and he lives in Charleston with his wife, Heidi. They worship with the Cathedral Church of St. Luke and St. Paul in downtown Charleston.
