***LIFEgroup Discussion Questions***  
***Sacred Psalms – Rebellion and Refuge***  
***July 13, 2014***

**Read:** Psalm 2

1. What is the structure of this Psalm? How does this help us in our study of it?
2. What is the problem that the Psalmist speaks of? What do we learn about the condition of humanity (2.1-3; Romans 3.23; Jeremiah 17.9; Romans 1.29-32)? Who are they going against (2.2)? What do the peoples and rulers of the earth not want (2.3)? What about us? Do we want the yoke of discipleship (Matthew 28-30)?
3. How does God respond to the rebellion of the peoples and rulers of the earth (2.4-6)? Who is God's King that He has installed? What does this reveal to us about God's will and plan?
4. In the third stanza of this Psalm we see something that seems most unique. Who does it seem is speaking here? What is He saying that has been granted to Him? When we think of the rebellion of man against God and the Messiah how do we see this toward Jesus? What did His crucifixion, resurrection and ascension declare (Acts 13.33-34; Philippians 2.8-11)? What is also in view on the earthly side of things (human affairs), when it comes to God installing his King for Israel (2 Samuel 7.13-16 – Davidic Covenant)?
5. What is the exhortation and warning given in light of the inevitable judgment for the nations' rebellion? What does it mean to do homage to the king? If they listen what does the Psalmist say they will experience (2.12; Psalm 5.11)?
6. How shall we live in light of Jesus' enthronement as King of Kings and Lord of Lords (Ephesians 2.6-7; Matthew 28.18-20)?
