LIFEGroup Discussion Questions
Sacred Psalms – The Old One Hundredth
July 27, 2014

Read: Psalm 100

1. Have someone read Psalm 100 to the LIFEgroup. Why do you think the Old Hundredth has been so special to people across 3 millenniums? Is anything about this Psalm special to you?
2. According to verse 1 we are to shout joyfully to the Lord. What does this mean? We live in a time when people have different preferences for worship. What's your preference? What do you think God desires? Do you think The Ridge should be more demonstrative in our worship?
3. Verse 2 talks about serving the Lord with gladness. What is your ministry at The Ridge? Do you serve gladly or reluctantly or whenever you please? How can you find gladness in serving?
4. Some days we find it hard to be joyful or serve gladly. Have someone read Psalm 137: 1-4. God's people were captives in Babylon and had a hard time worshipping God with joyful singing. Now read Psalm 137:5-6. What's the remedy for pulling out of tough circumstances?
5. Verse 3 also helps us put tough times in perspective. Have each member explain what this verse means to them.
6. Verse 4 says we are to enter God's gates with thanksgiving. What is your typical mood when you enter the parking lot of The Ridge? What can you do to walk through the front doors already experiencing joyful worship?
7. In verse 5, what does it mean that God is faithful to all generations? How can you be a blessing to the generations following you?
