Luke 17.1-19

How did your family of origin deal with conflict? (yelling, avoiding, passive aggressive, open communication...)

Chuck quoted Philip Yancey, who said that “the church’s mission is to be a haven of grace in the midst of a world of un-grace.” How have you experienced grace in the church?

How could Jesus’ love for us motivate growth toward being a “haven of grace”? How would our church life together look different if we were more a “haven of grace”?

How often do you participate in “exchanges of forgiveness” (asking or extending it)? What makes it challenging for you to do so? What helps you to do so?

What’s your initial reaction to Luke 17.7-10? How does Jesus’ instruction totally fly in the face of the values of our culture (and our natural hearts)?

What could motivate more humble faith in your life? What could convince you that just doing God’s will is enough?

Who could you serve this week without getting any “credit” for it? Ask one another for prayer in this.

Could you use the words “I forgive you” or “will you forgive me” with people instead of “sorry” or other phrases? What do you think would happen?
