Why does Jesus urge this man to sell everything and distribute to the poor? Does this command still apply to us today? In what way?

Why is it so difficult for those with wealth to enter the kingdom of God?

What emotions/responses does this stir up in your heart? Especially given the fact that we are among the wealthiest people in the history of the world?

How easy is it for you to talk about money? How come?

Chuck said that "each of us has a lifelong tug of war between money interests and the call of our soul". What are some recent examples of this tug of war in your life?

"What Jesus asked of the ruler, he himself would give for us." How might this loosen your grip on money and what it can give you?

Help one another see specific ways in which Jesus, as the author of life, satisfies us in ways that money and what it buys cannot?
