

January 2018 was a busy month for Pastor Manes Barthélemy, Lociana, and their 4 children. They moved to a rental house (compound) outside of the Tabarre Issa displaced persons camp where they have lived since the earthquake in early 2010. They have cleaned up and reorganized the house to serve both as a home for their family and the new location of Myosotis School. Children began attending school there on January 22nd. The students were treated to the first meal at the school on Tuesday, January 30th. Lociana is the head teacher at the school.

School opened in the new building on January 22.

Eglise Independente de Dieu continues to operate in their building in the camp. Worship, Bible Studies, and Prayer meetings are a regular part of the week. Pastor Manes visits the elderly, keeps in touch with his deacons, and cares for his congregation. He is working to find ways to meet needs in the community.

One future plan that the deacons would like to sponsor is to open a Community Center with adult classes in the former School Building. They would like to teach skills like sewing, carpentry, or cooking. Sewing may be the first project to launch.

Ongoing needs for these partners include beds for Max, Kennephise, Samuel, and Ruth Barthélemy, so they can sleep more comfortably than on the concrete floor. The church has need of children's chairs or benches, since the children's chairs are now at the school outside the church complex.

In March, we will introduce sponsorship of school needs. Possible opportunities include providing tuition scholarships, uniforms, meals for kids, bowls, school supplies, and school activities. There is much need in Haiti, but we hope to start helping people and children one at a time.
