Grace and Peace to you

Love One Another

For this is the message that you have heard from the beginning, that we should love one another. We should not be like Cain, who was of the evil one and murdered his brother. And why did he murder him? Because his own deeds were evil and his brother's righteous. Do not be surprised, brothers, that the world hates you. We know that we have passed out of death into life, because we love the brothers. Whoever does not love abides in death. Everyone who hates his brother is a murderer, and you know that no murderer has eternal life abiding in him.

By this we know love, that he laid down his life for us, and we ought to lay down our lives for the brothers. But if anyone has the world's goods and sees his brother in need, yet closes his heart against him, how does God's love abide in him? Little children, let us not love in word or talk but in deed and in truth. (1 John 3:11-18 ESV)

The high command to love is encouraging and crushing. Christians experience God's love in Jesus Christ and want to love like Jesus. However, we struggle with our sin and the sin of others which makes the command almost stifling. Thankfully, our loving God graciously grants whatever He commands from His servants. This is especially true of the command to love one another.

We are commanded to love God and our neighbor. It was a standard that Martin Luther knew he couldn't meet, and it almost drove him crazy. He said, "This word is too high and too hard that anyone should fulfill it. This is proved, not merely by our Lord's word, but by our own experience and feeling. Take any upright man or woman. He will get along very nicely with those who do not provoke him, but let someone proffer only the slightest irritation and he will flare up in anger, if not against friends, then against enemies. Flesh and blood cannot rise above it" (Martin Luther, *An Introduction to St. Paul's Letter to the Romans*, Erlangen: Heyder and Zimmer, 1854, 125). Martin Luther realized what a high standard was set by God, and he despaired because he didn't have the natural ability to love in this way. The bad news is none of us have the natural ability to do so.

The love of God is the good news. We love God because He first loved us. God loved us before we were born. He chose each of us to be His child. He knew each of us by name. God's love saved us. When we receive life-saving love, we can love God.

We must love the unlovable as God did with us so we continue to grow in the love of God. The only way we know perfect love is through Jesus. We learn about love by daily going to the cross and seeing Jesus' love for the unlovable. So, we need to preach the Gospel to ourselves daily.

When pastors and teachers tell us, "We need to preach the Gospel to ourselves daily." They are saying we must learn, study, and remember Jesus' love and sacrifice for the wicked, the rebellious, the indifferent, the cold and uncaring, the black-hearted like you and me. When we look to Jesus to learn about His perfect love and His sacrificial love for us, we find the power to love like Him.

Beloved, look to Jesus. Learn about Jesus' love. Study Jesus' love. Remember Jesus' love. Then, love one another.

Kids Quest Catechism Club

On Wednesday evening, February 3rd, WHPC initiated the Kids Quest Children's Catechism Club. This club is for ALL children of WHPC regardless of whether they attend on Wednesday evening or not. The goal is to have all 1st - 5th grade children learn the full and complete answers to the "First Catechism" questions 1-42 by Sunday, May, 15th. Children ages 3yrs to K will utilize a different program and set of standards. Each week the children will have the opportunity to say the answers for the assigned question to an adult WHPC "listener". Children participating on Wednesday evening may do this on Wednesdays from 6:00pm - 6:15 pm in room 106. All other children may do this on Sundays after worship in room 99 (1st-3rd grade classroom) across from the Sanctuary. Children who miss a week may make it up the following week.

Our WHPC children and Wednesday Night Kids have begun the process of memorizing the questions and answers of the "First Catechism". They are very excited. Now we need some adult friends like you to quiz them on what they have learned so they can earn some designated prizes as an incentive. WIC Circle Bible Study – “Having a Mary Heart in a Martha World, Finding Intimacy with God in the Busyness of Life”
by Joanna Weaver Chapter Two – “Lord, Don’t You Care?”

“Martha was distracted by all the preparations that had to be made. She came to Him and asked, “Lord, don’t you care that my sister has left me to do the work by myself? Tell her to help me!” “Luke 10:40

The Day Circle wasn’t able to meet in February due to the weather and some of the ladies in the Night Circle were unable to attend. I also know that some of you are reading the book even though you cannot attend Day or Night Circle. Therefore, I thought I would share a few highlights of our lesson.

Chapter 2 brings us into full view of reality – being distracted, being discouraged, and having doubts about God’s care for us. I love Martha’s question: “Lord, don’t you care?” It’s one we’ve all asked, isn’t it? And we’ve asked it after we think we’ve judged our circumstances rightly. We think we know what Mary should be doing, and that we are doing what pleases God, and if God really cared about us He certainly would see it our way and change the circumstances!!!

While Mary was “filling” her soul with the pure milk of Jesus’ words, Martha was “filling” her soul with a brew of the 3 Deadly Ds – Distractions, Discouragement, and Doubt. The whole situation started out well. As Linda Mowles pointed out in the Night Circle, Martha welcomed Jesus into her home, but a short time later she’s accusing Jesus of not caring and blaming her sister for not helping her. How do we get from a good place to a not-so-good place in 50 minutes flat? (The answer to that question will be in our next lesson – Chapter 3 – “The Diagnosis”). So what can we learn about finding intimacy with God from Martha’s question: “*Lord, don’t you care?*” Oh, so much!

First, intimacy with God isn’t dependent on our performance but on God’s faithfulness and unconditional love for us. God loves us even when we don’t choose the better part! Let me quote Philip Yancey from his book, *What’s So Amazing About Grace*: “There is nothing you can do to make God love you more...there is nothing you can do to make God love you less.” God loves you! Whether you’ve chosen the better part to sit at His feet or whether you’re distracted, discouraged, and doubtful, His love for you is the same! If we sit at His feet, He doesn’t love us more. If we are irritable, accusatory, and full of blame, He doesn’t love us less. Amazing love!

Second, Martha knew where to go. She went to Jesus. Despite her motives, she went to the person who had the answer to her situation. And that’s where we need to go. Our memory verse for Chapter 2 was Psalm 62:8 “Trust in Him at all times, O people; pour out your hearts to Him, for God is our refuge.” We can take everything to Jesus – good and bad.

Third, Jesus is in the “life” boat with us. He has told us we’re going to the other side. He is there when the storms of life assail us. He has the power to overcome all storms. (Mark 4:35-41)

This is what “finding intimacy with God in the busyness of life” is truly all about. We have an intimate relationship with Jesus. He has placed the “engagement ring” on our finger, pledging His faithfulness to us, in sickness and in health, in richer or poorer, in good times and bad times. He has covenanted with us to be His Bride; He is preparing an eternal home for us, and He is planning the wedding of all weddings!



To know and be known, without fear of loss – that is what keeps intimacy growing. And that is what we have in Christ – To know Him, to know that He knows us better than we know ourselves, and to know that no matter the “scorecard”, He loves us the same. Jesus was available to both Mary and Martha and He loved them both the same.

So be encouraged today, Ladies! God loves you! Let Him “fill” you so that He can “spill” you for His glory!
