

Look up and read your memory verse, Colossians 1:10, in your Bible.

Let's discover what it means to be faithful. As you learn about God, you will start to trust, obey, and love Him more and more. You will be faithful and walk in a manner that is worthy of God.

When you play follow the leader, you have to know who the leader is and what he or she is doing. When you are being faithful, you are not just following any leader, you are following God.

Psalm 37:3-6

Trust in the LORD, and do good; dwell in the land and befriend faithfulness. Delight yourself in the LORD, and He will give you the desires of your heart. Commit your way to the LORD; trust in Him, and He will act. He will bring forth your righteousness as the light, and your justice as the noonday.

When we follow God, we're being faithful to Him. We're saying He is trustworthy because He is God.

God wants you to trust Him with all of your heart and with everything that happens in your life.

When we acknowledge (know and recognize) God in our lives, we show trust and have faith.

Look up and read 2 Chronicles 31:20-21 in your Bible.

Look up and read your memory verse, 1 Timothy 6:11, in your Bible.

Let's discover how God gives us grace to have gentleness and self-control.

Have you ever played the game tag? When you play tag, there is someone who is "It." "It" runs around chasing the other players. When "It" tags another player, he or she becomes "It." When you are "It," you run and try with all of your might to tag someone.

Your memory verse is telling us that we should pursue (run hard after) six things and make them our goal. What are those things? The first three are done for you.

Let's take a minute to understand "gentleness." Gentleness, or meekness, is not weakness. It doesn't mean that you let people treat you however they want. It is "power under control." It is a humble and gentle attitude that doesn't seek revenge.

What do we mean when we say "self-control"? Having self-control means denying what our sinful nature may want to do. It is choosing to walk in a manner worthy of God instead of making a choice based on how you feel. What would that look like?

DISCOVERY OF GENTLENESS AND SELF-CONTROL 4.6 Jesus had been beaten, put on trial, made fun of, and nailed to a cross. He had every right to be angry and to react badly. But He is God and is our best example of gentleness and self-control. Instead of reacting, Look up and read about a man named Stephen in Acts 7:57-60. What did Stephen pray in verse 60? Lord, do not hold this _____ against them.

Stephen was being stoned to death. Instead of shouting back at his attackers, he prayed that God would forgive them. That kind of gentleness and self-control can only come from God and His grace.

When someone makes you angry, how does God want you to react?

God will help you to have gentleness and self-control as you grow in your relationship with Him. This is a way you can love others with God's love!
