Tuesday, February 26, 2019**

- Council had an open discussion about Pastor Carel's retirement and transition. Pastor Carel is eligible to retire in 2020. Council will be assessing the team ministry model and providing guidance to the pastors to consider in their 2019 Pastors' Retreat.

- Council received various reports from staff, ministries, and committees, and responded to communications.

## Mission Strategy Updates

Through the Winter 2019 issue *Mission Strategy Newsletter* the congregation was presented a number of specific challenges. Here is a summary of where you as congregation of CCRC have stepped up to meet those challenges.

**Challenge #1:** To raise \$14,000 for Missionary Support. We are right on track to achieving this goal. The total raised so far is; \$3588.40 which means we have met the quarterly goal. Donations for this challenge have been coming in every week, **Thank you!** so much for leaning into this challenge. At the next quarterly offering, scheduled for April, we hope to do another “live via video” meeting with one of our missionaries.

**Challenge #2:** With a small group of volunteers we hope to go and explore how CCRC can be more deeply engaged with DayStar ministries and the work of the Ps on Manitoulin Island. A group of volunteers from Community 2 is interested in meeting this challenge. We are working on the details and timing of this challenge, stay tuned for more on this opportunity.

**Challenge #3:** The SERVE 2019 trip to Muskegon has a logistics coordinator. A big thank you to Jane V for stepping into this short term volunteer role. All of the places for youth have been filled. Still needed are 2 female adult leaders. Please contact Jane or Pastor Amada for details of this opportunity. Plans are being made for a SERVE trip fundraiser. We are looking forward to that event!

**Challenge #4:** Learning about the impact of being in a “missional community” is our fourth challenge. Resonate Global Mission is a partner in the Mission Montreal project. Mission Montreal has over 60 missional communities and three projects serving refugees, serving students and serving youth. All of these projects are transforming the city. Going to Montreal to see first hand how these projects have had an impact may help us in our Communities to find ways in which to bring shalom to the KW area. This challenge has not been met as yet. If you are interested in a road trip to visit Montreal, please speak to Pastor Carel. We will also need a person to be a translator for the group.
