Composer Biographies

Ludwig van Beethoven (1770—1827) was a German pianist and composer. His first music teacher was his own father, who recognized his talent at a young age, and helped him tour and perform for audiences. At 13, he wrote his first published composition. Throughout his career, Beethoven wrote over 100 hours worth of music. During the end of his life, Beethoven had become almost entirely deaf. However, he continued to write music as his hearing worsened. It was music, he stated, that kept him going. Learn more at Classics for Kids.



Florence Beatrice Price (1887—1953) was the first African-American woman composer to have her music played by a major US orchestra. She studied organ and piano in the New England Conservatory of Music. Her Symphony No. 1 in E minor was performed at the World's Fair in Chicago in 1933. The World's Fair was a showcase of inventions, art and ideas. For many years, Price's music was lost and not performed, but in the last 5 years it has been discovered, restored and is being performed worldwide. Learn more at Classics for Kids.

Alberto Ginastera (1916—1983) was a popular Latin American composer from Argentina. He was also a professor and director at the National Conservatory. His piece Danza Final is also called "Malambo". "Malambo" refers to a type of dance by Argentinean cowboys called "gauchos". During the dance, the gauchos wear boots and make rhythmic tap sounds. When the orchestra plays "Malambo", the rhythms are heard through the tambourine, castanets and in the melodies by the winds and strings. Learn more at MPR.
