


VIOLA

The viola is in the **string** family, meaning it produces sound by plucking, strumming, or bowing the strings! For the viola, players will most commonly pluck or bow. The plucking of strings is called **pizzicato**.

The viola is considered an <u>alto</u> instrument, which means its sound is slightly lower than its soprano cousin, the <u>violin</u>. The <u>pitch</u> of the viola is lower than the violin because the viola is larger. The viola's strings from low to high are C G D A and cover a four octave range!
