

RESOLUTION NO. 569 CMS

DECLARING THE WEEK OF FEBRUARY 13, 1967 to the 19th AMERICAN NEGRO HISTORY WEEK. RECOGNIZING CONTRIBUTIONS OF THE AMERICAN NEGRO TO THE CULTURE OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Oberlin, Lorain County, Ohio:

SECTION 1. That since the founding, growth, and prosperity of the United States can be attributed to deeds of many divergent cultures, races, and creeds; and

SECTION 2. That since the full story of the Negro's contribution to the growth of this country has rarely been told; and

SECTION 3. That since the names of Crispus Attucks, Phyllis Wheatley, Frederick Douglass, Ralph Bunche, Senator Brooks and others have contributed to the political, economic and social life of America; and

SECTION 4. That since the story of contributions ranges from pre-colonial days to the threshold of the super-sonic age;

NOW THEREFORE, be it hereby resolved that these contributions which are dramatically woven into the pattern of American culture is evidence of the American Negro's continuing fight for first-class citizenship. This rich heritage should be a lasting monument of spiritual and physical encouragement to the youth of today, who can gain purpose, dedication and moral strength through the knowledge and awareness of Negro History which will inspire them to walk with dignity and to live a life which is purposeful and rewarding in an integrated society.


