

RESOLUTION NO. R87-10 CMS

A RESOLUTION ENDORSING THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE COUNTY-WIDE ENHANCED 911 TELEPHONE EMERGENCY SYSTEM BEING CONSIDERED BY THE LORAIN COUNTY COMMISSIONERS AND THE 911 PLANNING COMMITTEE

WHEREAS, an enhanced telephone emergency system is being considered by the Lorain County Commissioners for installation throughout the County; and

WHEREAS, the county-wide enhanced 911 telephone system provides services to all political jurisdictions throughout Lorain County which can be cities, villages and townships; and

WHEREAS, the Primary Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP) in Lorain County will be a fully operational and staffed 24 hour answering point that receives incoming enhanced 911 calls from the public and will screen and transfer or relay messages to EMS (life squad) personnel in response to the call or dispatch calls in some identified jurisdictions; and

WHEREAS, the Secondary PSAP will dispatch police, fire and emergency medical services to departments and jurisdictions it serves; and

WHEREAS, the enhanced 911 emergency telephone system will be most useful and beneficial to the elderly, the young, the disabled and those persons who are involved in an emergency situation; and

WHEREAS, the enhanced emergency telephone system will be beneficial to all residents of Lorain County by handling emergencies more quickly and efficiently;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Oberlin, County of Lorain, State of Ohio, a majority of all members elected thereto concurring:


SECTION 1. That the Council of the City of Oberlin does hereby endorse the implementation of the county-wide enhanced 911 emergency telephone system being considered by the Lorain County Commissioners.

SECTION 2. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning or relating to the adoption of this resolution were adopted in an open meeting of the Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 3. That this resolution shall take effect at the earliest date allowed by law.
