

ORDINANCE NO. 96 AC CMS

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 73 CODIFIED
ORDINANCE 373.99, PENALTY

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Oberlin, Lorain
County, Ohio, a majority of all members elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1: Codified Ordinance 373.99 presently reading:

373.99 PENALTY. "Whoever violates this chapter shall be
deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be fined not
exceeding fifty dollars (\$50.00) and the court may prohibit
such person from riding a bicycle for a period not to
exceed six months.

Whoever violates this chapter may be punished by having his
bicycle impounded for a period not exceeding thirty days,"

is hereby amended to read as follows:

373.99 PENALTY. "Whoever violates this chapter shall be
deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and for violation of all
Sections thereof except 373.12 shall be fined not less than
One Dollar (\$1.00) nor more than fifty dollars (\$50.00) and
the Court may prohibit such person from driving a bicycle
for a period not to exceed six months and the bicycle of
such person may be impounded for a period not exceeding
thirty days.

Whoever violates ^{section} Ordinance No. 373.12 shall be guilty of a
misdemeanor and shall be fined not less than one dollar (\$1.00)
nor more than fifty dollars (\$50.00) unless within three days
after citation said person appears at City Hall, signs a waiver,
pays a fine of one dollar (\$1.00) and provides satisfactory
evidence that he has secured a bicycle license. In the event
that no appearance is made within three days from the citation,
said person shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall
be fined not less than one dollar (\$1.00) nor more than
fifty dollars (\$50.00)."

SECTION 2: This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency
measure, the emergency being to provide for the operation and enforcement
of the Bicycle Licensing Ordinance, and shall take immediate effect upon
its passage.
