

ORDINANCE NO. 252 AG 1962

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING PEDESTRIAN CROSSWALKS  
AND SIGNS FOR SAME IN THE CITY OF OBERLIN, OHIO

WHEREAS, pedestrian crosswalks are deemed necessary for the safety of the Citizens of the City of Oberlin.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Council of the City of Oberlin, five-sevenths of all members elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1. Pedestrian crosswalks are hereby established on South Main Street just north of the Peoples Office of the Lorain County Savings and Trust Company, on North Main Street, near Hall Auditorium on East College Street, near T. O. Murphy Co., and on West College Street at it's intersection with College Place.

SECTION 2. Said crosswalks shall be at least 8 feet wide and shall be that space between two parallel yellow lines extending from curb to curb. The space between said parallel lines shall be striped with yellow diagonal lines and on each side of said crosswalks there shall be painted the word "Yield".

SECTION 3. Where practical, there shall be suspended by steel cable a sign with the words "Cross Walk" painted thereon. Said signs to be at least 12" x 24" and suspended at least 10 feet above the paved portion of the street.

SECTION 4. Where convenient the signs so suspended may also be lettered with the words "Off Street Parking" and an arrow designating the direction of such off-street parking area.

SECTION 5. All vehicular traffic using the streets of the City of Oberlin shall yield the right of way to all pedestrians using and within the confines of the designated crosswalks of the City of Oberlin.

SECTION 6. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be fined not more than \$100.00 and costs.

SECTION 7. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from the earliest period allowed by law.
