ORDINANCE NO. 273 AC CMS

TO LEVY SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF HOLLYWOOD STREET BY INSTALLATION OF A STORM SEVER, CONCRETE CURBS AND GUTTERS AND PAVING. EMENGENCY

BE IT CADAINED by the Council of the City of Oberlin, State of Ohio, Lordin County, five-sevenths (5/7s) of all mambers elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1. That the assessment of the cost and expense of improving Bollywood Street from and including the point of intersection with Union Street north to a point coinciding with the northeast corner of lot No. 123 of the Bollywood Addition, an approximate distance of 425.6 feet, by installing a storm accor, concrete curbs and gutters, as required, and paving with eight (8) inches of compacted base and two (2) inches of blacktop, together with necessary appurtenances amounting in the aggregate to \$12,514.35 (without interest), as reported to this Council on September 17, 1962, by the City Engineer, notice of filing of which accessment has been served on all owners of propostics to be assessed, be, and the same is hereby adopted and confirmed, and that there be and are hereby levied and assessed upon the lots and lands bounding and abutting upon said improvement the several assessed as aforesaid, which accessments and the description of said lots and lands are now on file in the office of the Clark of this Council and which assessments are in proportion to the special bonefits and are not in excess of any essentiony limitation.

SECTION 2. That the total assessment spainst each lot or parcel of land shall be payable in cash within thirty (30) days from and ofter the passage of this ordinance, or, at the option of the owner, in tenn (10) annual installments with interest at the same rate so shall be borne by the bonds to be issued in anticipation of the collection of the same. All cash payments shall be made to the Transurer of said City. All assessments and installments thereof remaining unpaid at the expiration of said thirty (30) days shall be certified by the Clark to the County Auditor as provided by law to be placed by him on the tax duplicate and collected as other taxes are collected.

SECTION 3. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency mansure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety, and welfare of said City, and for the further reason that immediate lovy of said assessments is necessary to meet collection requirements and to permit issuance of bonds to rotize notes about to fell due; wherefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and immediately after its passage.
