

ORDINANCE NO. 322 AC CMS

AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE AND/OR PROHIBIT LOUD,
DISTURBING AND UNNECESSARY NOISE WITHIN THE
CITY OF OBERLIN

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of Oberlin,
Lorain County, Ohio, a majority of all members elected thereto
concurring:

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful in the City of Oberlin
to

- A. Sound any horn or signal device on any automobile, motorcycle, bus or truck when not in motion except as a danger signal if another vehicle is approaching out of control, or if in motion only as a danger signal and as authorized by the traffic control laws of the State of Ohio.
- B. Conduct any excavation, demolition or construction operations except on week days from 7:00 A.M. to 6:00 P.M., except utility crews operating on an emergency call.
- C. To use drums, loudspeakers or other instruments for commercial or advertising purposes.
- D. To use mechanical loudspeakers or loudspeakers, whether stationary or mounted, on vehicles for advertising or commercial purposes.

SECTION 2. Whoever violates any part of Section 1 shall be fined not more than \$50.00 and costs of prosecution.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from the earliest period allowed by law.
