AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 31 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF OBERLIN

WHEREAS: There has been reported to Council instances of invasion of rights of privacy of imabitants of this city by solicitors, canvasses and peddlers invading, without invitation or permission, and entering against their wishes into the homes of said imbebitants; and

WHEREAS: It is the further opinion of this Council that under the guise of soliciting, canvassing and peddling, it is possible for persons bent upon the commission of crimes and misdementors to seek out occasions and opportunities for such artivities while ostensibly conducting legitimate business; and that it is a reasonable exercise of the police power of this municipality to provide for a fair and reasonable maximal of investigation into the background and resord of persons seeking to canvass, paddle, solated within Oberlin and to keep a record of such persons, and to assure a mathod of identification of them.

MOW THEREFORE, BE IT CEDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF OBERLAN, LORAIN COUNTY, CHIO, a majority of the members elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1. LECENSE.

No person shall sell or offer for sale, barter or exchange, or go from door to door soliciting the purchase of, or gift of any goods, wares, merchandise or other articles of value or money, in any place, in, upon, along, or through the streets, evenues, alleys or other public places within the municipality, unless he is the holder of a license which is in full force and effect and issued pursuant to the provisions of this chapter, which license said person shall, at all times, have with him while enercising such calling; and shall exhibit said license to any police officer of official of this municipality upon demand.

SECTION 2. APPLICATION.

Applicants for permit and license under this ordinance must file with the City Kanager a everm application in writing (in duplicate) on a form to be furnished by the City Manager, which shall give the following information:

(a) Name and description of the applicant:

(b) Permanent home address and full local address of the applicant;

(c) A brief description of the nature of the business and the goods to be sold, or the solicitation to be made;

(d) If employed, the name and address of the employer, together with credentials establishing the anact relationship;

(c) The length of time for which the right to do business or solicit is desired;

(f) The place where the goods or property proposed to be sold, or orders taken for the sale thereof, are manufactured or produced, there such goods or products are located at the time said application is filed, and the proposed method of delivery; (g) Reasonable proof of their identy, permanent business and/or home address, authority to act for his principal or employer, if any, financial responsibility, ownership or rights to sell the articles or other such data as is reasonably necessary to prevent deception upon the residents or inhabitants of Oberlin by said applicant;

- (h) The fingerprints of the applicant and the names of at least two reliable property owners of the County of Lorain, State of Ohio, who will certify as to the applicant's good character and business respectability, or, in lieu of the names of references, such other evailable evidence as will enable an investigator to properly evaluate such character and business responsibility.
- (1) A statement as to whether or not the applicant has been convicted of any crime, misdemeanor, or violation of any municipal ordinance, the nature of the offense and the punishment or panalty essessed therefor.
- (j) A photograph of the applicant on a size as prescribed by the City Manager.

BECTTON 3. INVESTIGATION AND ISSUANCE.

- (a) Upon receipt of such application, the original shall be referred to the Chics of Police, who shall cause such investigation of the applicant's business and moral character to be made as is deemed necessary for the protection of the public good.
- (b) If, as a result of such investigation, the applicant's character or business responsibility is found to be unsatisfactory, the City Manager shall emdorse on such application his disapproval and his reasons for same, and notify the applicant that said application is disapproved and that no parmit or license will be issued.
- (s) If as a result of such investigation, the character and business responsibility of the applicant are found to be estimated by the City Manager shall endorse on the application his approval for the carrying on of the business applied for, and upon payment of the prescribed license fee, a license will be issued. A permanent record shall be kept of all licenses tasked.
- (d) Said license shall be in the form of a permit with a plastic container showing the photograph of the applicant.

Upon the insurance to an applicant of a license as provided, the applicant shall be given authorization in such form as shall be prescribed by the City Manager. Upon each of the applications for licenses, the City Manager shall receive a fee of

SECTION 5. EXCEPTIONS.

The following persons are declared enempt from the payment of any license fee for the license hereinabove mentioned, to-wit:

Any person solling the products of his own raising, a manufacturer solling any articles manufactured by him, a person solling newspapers, a duly authorized solicitor soliciting the purchasing of goods, weres, merchandies, or gifts for or on behalf of any recognized educational, civic, religious, or charitable organization, and all other persons otherwise exampted by law provided, however, it shall be unlawful for any such person to engage in the operation of solling or soliciting, as more fully described in Section 1, in the city without first obtaining a permit from the city so to do, which permit shall be issued without fee and shall be reveable for thuse and shall expire by limitation on the thirty-first (31) day of December following the date of its issuance,

Section 6. Took Liverations.

It shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer for sale, baster, or exchange, sad/or to solicit from door to door the purchase or gift of any goods, varse, acceleration, or other articles of value within the city during the period from thirty (39) minutes after sunset any day to thirty (30) minutes before curried of the next succeeding day.

SECTION 7. REVOCATION OR SUSPENSION OF LICENSE.

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Any license issued horounder may be revoked or suspended at any time, should the percente whom it is issued be guilty of any fraud, misrepresent etien, desption or wrongful act in connection with his business or otherwise, or is found to be a person set fit to be engaged in such business. But is easy event, all licenses issued under this chapter shall terminate on the thrity-first (II) day of December following the date of issuence.

Section 6. Penalth.

Any person violating any portion of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a miodemeasur and fined not to exceed One Hundred Bollars (\$190.00) and in addition, his license may be revoked by the City Menager.

SECTION 9. This ordinance chall be in full force and effect from and effect the carlines period allowed by law.
