

ORDINANCE NO. 567 AC CMS

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING UNLAWFUL ASSEMBLIES
AND DECLARING SAME AN EMERGENCY

Be It ordained by the Council of the City of Oberlin, Lorain County, Ohio, five-sevenths (5/7ths) of all members elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for persons to congregate to the number of three (3) or more upon any sidewalk or at any street corner, in front of any dwelling house, place of business, parking area, place of worship or amusement, or other public place in the City of Oberlin, Ohio, in such a manner as to cause any obstruction. It shall be the power of the Police Department to disperse such assemblies.

SECTION 2. Whoever violates this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not less than \$50.00 nor more than \$200.00 and costs, or not more than Thirty (30) days in Jail or both, no part of which shall be suspended.

SECTION 3. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the City of Oberlin, Lorain County, Ohio, to-wit:

"To prevent unlawful assemblies and disturbances"

and shall take effect immediately upon passage.
