AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING AN EASEMENT THROUGH PROPERTY OWNED BY NORA J. MARTIN.

WHEREAS, on the 20th day of May, 1968, the Council of the City of Oberlin, Lorain County, Ohio, adopted Resolution No. 593 CMS declaring the necessity and intent to appropriate a permanent easement over land owned by Nora J. Martin hereinafter described, and Notice of the adoption of said Resolution was served on the owner of record of said premises, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Oberlin, Lorain County, Ohio, five-sevenths (5/7ths) of all members elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1. That a permanent easement interest in and to the following described real estate be and the same is hereby appropriated for the public purpose of providing a storm sewer ditch:

"Situated in the City of Oberlin, County of Lorain and State of Ohio, and being a part of Original Russia Township Lot No. 77 and being part of Lorain County Auditor's permanent Parcel No. 9-00-077-101-012 and being a strip of land 40 feet in width for a temporary construction easement, and a 25 feet in width strip for a permanent easement of which the following is the center line:

Beginning at a point in the Easterly line of lands in Original Lot No. 77 now owned by Oberlin Improvement and Development Corporation, Inc. and known as Parcel No. 9-00-077-101-010 of Lorain County Auditor's Records, and 975 feet Northerly from the Southwesterly corner of Nora J. Martin's lands; thence Southeasterly 490 feet to a point 490 feet Westerly from this center line of Crosby Street and 715 feet Northerly from the center line of the New York Central Railroad right-of-way as measured in a line parallel to the center line of Crosby Street; thence Easterly a distance of 460 feet to a point in the Westerly line of Crosby Street at its intersection with the Northerly line of the New York Central Railroad right-of-way."

SECTION 2. That the City Solicitor be and he is hereby authorized and directed to apply to a court of competent jurisdiction to have a jury impaneled to make inquiry into and assess the compensation to be paid for the permanent easement interest in said property.

SECTION 3. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, safety, and welfare of the City of Oberlin, Ohio, to-wit:

"To provide adequate storm water drainage and shall take effect immediately upon passage."
