

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE CONSTRUCTION OF CLEAR WATER CONNECTIONS TO THE SANITARY SEWER SYSTEM OF THE CITY OF OBERLIN, OHIO

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Oberlin, Lorain County, Ohio, a majority of all members elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1. The term "clear water connection" shall mean any pipe, fitting or other plumbing fixture which permits the discharge of clear, unpolluted storm, surface, or ground water from roof drains, subsoil drainage systems, building foundation drainage systems, and cistern overflows.

SECTION 2. The construction of any clear water connections to the sanitary sewer system of the City of Oberlin, Ohio from and after the effective date of this Ordinance, shall be unlawful and shall be prohibited.

SECTION 3. To enforce the provisions of this Ordinance, the City Manager and/or The Director of Public Works of the City of Oberlin, or an authorized representative of the City, shall be permitted to enter upon all property for the purpose of making inspections.

SECTION 4. Any person who shall violate the provisions of this Ordinance, shall upon conviction thereof, be fined not more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00), nor less than Ten Dollars (\$10.00) for each offense, and a separate offense shall be deemed to have been committed each period of Twenty-four (24) hours such violation shall continue after a period of Thirty (30) days following the original conviction.

SECTION 5. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
