

AN ORDINANCE ACCEPTING THE BID OF BURROUGHS MANUFACTURING COMPANY FOR AN L-5000 DATA PROCESSING EQUIPMENT AND SETTING FORTH THE APPROPRIATIONS REQUIRED FROM CERTAIN FUNDS TO PAY FOR SAME, AND DECLARING SAME AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Oberlin, Lorain County, Ohio, Five-sevenths (5/7ths) of all members elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1. That the bid of Burroughs Manufacturing Company being the best and lowest bid for the furnishing of certain data processing equipment, said bid being in the amount of Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00), is hereby accepted and the acting City Manager is hereby authorized to enter into a contract for same.

SECTION 2. In order to provide funds for the payment of the L-5000 Burroughs Computer, the following amounts are appropriated:

Electric Operating Fund -----	\$ 14,000.00
Water Replacement Fund -----	5,000.00
Sewer Replacement Fund -----	2,000.00
General Fund (Contingent Acct) -	9,000.00
	<u>\$ 30,000.00</u>

SECTION 3. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Oberlin, Ohio, to-wit:

"To provide for more efficient utility billing and shall take effect immediately upon passage."
